Tone 7 Troparion (Resurrection)

By Thy <u>Cross</u> Thou didst destroy <u>death</u>. To the thief Thou didst open <u>Paradise</u>. For the <u>Myrrh</u>bearers Thou didst change weeping into <u>joy</u>, and Thou didst command Thy disciples, O <u>Christ</u> God, to pro<u>claim</u> that Thou art <u>risen</u>,// granting the <u>world</u> great <u>mercy</u>.

Tone 1 Troparion (for the Cross)

O <u>Lord</u>, save Thy <u>people</u>, and bless Thine in<u>her</u>itance! <u>Grant</u> victories to the Orthodox <u>Chris</u>tians over their <u>ad</u>versaries; and by <u>vir</u>tue of Thy <u>Cross</u>,// preserve Thy habitation!

Tone 7 Kontakion (for the Cross)

Now the <u>flaming</u> sword no longer guards the gates of <u>Eden</u>; it has been mysteriously quenched by the <u>wood</u> of the Cross. The <u>sting</u> of death and the victory of hell have been <u>van</u>quished; for Thou, O my Savior, hast come and cried to <u>those</u> in hell:// <u>"Enter again into Paradise!"</u>

(In place of the Trisagion, we sing:)

Before Thy Cross, we bow down in worship, O Master, and Thy holy Resurrection, we glorify.

Tone 6 Prokeimenon (Cross)

O Lord, save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance! (Ps 27/28:9))

v: To Thee, O Lord, will I call. O my God, be not silent to me! (Ps 27/28:1)

Epistle Hebrews 4:14-5:6

Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession.

For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

For every high priest taken from among men is appointed for men in things pertaining to God, that he may offer both gifts and sacrifices for sins.

He can have compassion on those who are ignorant and going astray, since he himself is also subject to weakness.

Because of this he is required as for the people, so also for himself, to offer sacrifices for sins.

And no man takes this honor to himself, but he who is called by God, just as Aaron was.

So also Christ did not glorify Himself to become High Priest, but it was He who said to Him: "You are My Son, today I have begotten You." As He also says in another place: "You are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek";

For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake and the gospel's will save it.

For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul?

Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul?

For whoever is ashamed of Me and My words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him the Son of Man also will be ashamed when He comes in the glory of His Father with the holy angels."

And He said to them, "Assuredly, I say to you that there are some standing here who will not taste death till they see the kingdom of God present with power."

For just as Christ in His manhood was sinless by nature both in flesh and in soul, so we too who believe in Him, and have clothed ourselves in Him through the Spirit, can be without sin in Him if we so choose."
