### **Gospel John 7:37-52; 8:12**

*On the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink.*

*He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water."*

*But this He spoke concerning the Spirit, whom those believing in Him would receive; for the Holy Spirit was not yet given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.*

*Then the Pharisees answered them, "Are you also deceived?"*

*Have any of the rulers or the Pharisees believed in Him?"*

*But this crowd that does not know the law is accursed."*

*Nikodemos (he who came to Jesus by night, being one of them) said to them,*

*"Does our law judge a man before it hears him and knows what he is doing?"*

*They answered and said to him, "Are you also from Galilee? Search and look, for no prophet has arisen out of Galilee."*

*Then Jesus spoke to them again, saying, "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life."*

Rejoice, O Queen, glory of mothers and virgins!

No tongue, however sweet or fluent, is eloquent enough to praise thee worthily.

Every mind is overawed by thy childbearing.

Therefore, with one voice, we glorify thee.

### **This Week's Announcement**

***Blessed Pentecost & Happy Father's Day*** Pentecost is the “Birthday of the Church”, the celebration of the coming of the Holy Spirit. The coming of the Holy Spirit is celebrated together with the full revelation of the Divine Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The fullness of the Godhead is manifested with the Spirit's coming to man, and the Church hymns celebrate this manifestation as the final act of God's self-disclosure and self-donation to the world of His creation. Do not forget the traditional Vespers of Pentecost with the special “Kneeling prayers” will be served immediately following liturgy today. We also want to wish a blessed Father's Day to all our wonderful fathers of St. Michael's! May God grant you many years!

***All Saints Sunday Blessing*** The Sunday after Pentecost is the feast of All Saints. This is the logical liturgical sequence since the coming of the Holy Spirit is fulfilled in the human race by their becoming saints, and this is the very purpose of the creation and salvation of the world. Following Liturgy next week (weather permitting), we will process outside for an icon procession. Bring your favorite saints' icon for the procession and join us as we celebrate the feast of All Saints.

***All Parish Meeting*** We will have an all parish meeting next Sunday June 27 following the Divine Liturgy. Please be sure to stay to participate as we all do our part to care for Christ's Holy Church.

***Ss. Peter and Paul Fast*** The spirit of Holy Pentecost leads us to another feast and fast of the church. The feast of the Holy Apostles Peter and Paul is celebrated on June 29th. From the 4th Century on, the Church has celebrated this feast which is spiritually linked with Holy Pentecost. It

stands as the witness of the Apostles immediate fruit at the descent of the Holy Spirit when it came upon them. The Feast is preceded by a fasting period called Saints Peter and Paul Fast.” The fast is different from year to year since it always begins on the Monday following the first Sunday after Pentecost (All Saints' Sunday). The fast lasts just one day this year beginning on June 28<sup>th</sup> the eve of the feast of Ss. Peter and Paul. We will offer Great Vespers with Litiya for the feast on June 28<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. and on June 29<sup>th</sup> Divine Liturgy commemorating the great Peter and Paul.

### **Wisdom from the Holy Fathers**

*"A man takes a walk and sees something. His thoughts say to him, 'Go over there and investigate,' and he says to his thoughts, 'No! I won't,' and he cuts off his desire. Again he finds someone gossiping, and his thoughts say to him, 'You go and have a word with them,' and he cuts off his desire, and does not speak. Or again his thoughts say to him, 'Go up and ask the cook what's cooking?' and he does not go, but cuts off his desire. Then he sees something else, and his thoughts say to him, 'Go down and ask, who brought it?' and he does not ask. A man denying himself in this way comes little by little to form a habit of it, so that from denying himself in little things, he begins to deny himself in great without the least trouble. Finally he comes not to have any of these extraneous desires, but whatever happens to him he is satisfied with it, as if it were the very thing he wanted. And so, not desiring to satisfy his own desires, he finds himself always doing what he wants to. For not having his own special fancies, he fancies every single thing that happens to him. Thus he is found to be without special attachments, and from this state of tranquility he comes to the state of holy indifference."*
